

Atchara Sripon, Pol.Sgt. 2006: Job Satisfaction of Police Officers in Crime Against Child, Juvenile and Woman Suppression Division. Master of Arts (Applied Sociology), Major Field: Applied Sociology, Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
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The purposes of this study were to examine the level of job satisfaction of police officers in Crime Against Child, Juvenile and Woman Suppression Division. Job satisfaction was identified in the context of demographic factors and job characteristics by using questionnaires as data collecting tools from 175 samples group. Statistic analysis were percentage, mean, standard deviation and hypothesis testing by t – test, F – test at 0.05 significantly statistic level.

The results indicate that majority of the respondents were male with an average age 41.17 years old, average work tenure 18.70 years, currently ranked as sergeant, married and Bachelor degree holders with average monthly incomes 15,262.32 Baht and are moderately satisfied with their jobs. The demographic factors found to be significantly related with job satisfaction of the police officers in Crime Against Child, Juvenile and Woman Suppression Division are sex, age and rank. The task significance is only one variable among the work characteristic that affects to job satisfaction, while the rest of the characteristics are not related to job satisfaction.

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
