

Pornthip Suksonghong 2012: Attitude Toward Instruction of Domestic Work Course of Matthayomsuksa 1 Students in Nonthaburi Province. Master of Arts (Home Economics Education), Major Field: Home Economics Education, Department of Vocational Education. Thesis Advisor: Assistant Professor Shiepsumon Rungsayatorn, Ph.D. 164 pages.

The purposes of this study were to investigate and compare: 1) students' attitude toward instruction of domestic work course and 2) students' attitude toward values and benefits of domestic work course. Data were collected, using a questionnaire, from 400 sampled students. Data were analyzed to obtain percentage, mean, standard deviation, t-test and one way analysis of variance (ANOVA).

The findings revealed that students had positive attitude toward instruction of domestic work course concerning instruction preparation, learning experience and instructional media usage. However, students' attitude toward learning atmosphere, and measurement and evaluation were rated at a neutral level. Regarding attitude toward values and benefits of domestic work course, the results showed that students had great positive attitude toward values and benefits of domestic work course.

The hypothesis testing showed statistically significant difference of students' attitude toward instruction of domestic work course as compared by students' demography, except mother's occupation. The similar manner found in students' attitude toward values and benefits of domestic work course, except parents' occupation.
