

Chalatip Leengoun, Major 2006: Factors Related to Health Promoting Behaviors of Personnel in Phramongkutklao Hospital. 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The purpose of this descriptive research was to study factors related to health promoting behaviors of personnel in Phramongkutklao Hospital. The samples were 368 personnel in Phramongkutklao Hospital. The research instrument was the questionnaire constructed by the researcher. The data analysis was made for percentage, mean and standard deviation. The relationship between the variable factors and personnel's health promoting behaviors were analyzed by Chi-square test and Pearson's Product Moment Correlation Coefficient. The comparative analysis of variance and the predicting factors participative behaviors were analyzed by Multiple Regression Analysis. The research results were as follows.

1. The Phramongkutklao Hospital personnel's health promoting behaviors were at the medium level. 2. The bio-social factors which related to the personnel's health promoting behaviors was position. 3. Predisposing factors which related to the personnel's health promoting behaviors were knowledge on health promoting behaviors and attitudes toward health promoting behaviors. 4. Enabling factors which related to the personnel's health promoting behaviors were health behavior policies and projects and the hospital's environment. 5. Reinforcing factor which related to the personnel's health promoting was social support from people. 6. The predicting factors participative behaviors were social support, attitudes, policies and projects and the hospital's environment which can predict approximately 42.5 percents and the most powerful predictive variable was social support that can predict approximately 32.5 percents of the personnel's health promoting behaviors.
