

Naruemon Opanon 2008: Factors Affective the Stress of the Students of Senior Primary School : A Case Study in Watwisadkarn School, Bangkok Noi District, Bangkok Metropolitan. Master of Science (Health Education), Major Field: Health Education, Department of Physical Education. Thesis Advisor: Associate Professor Supat Teravecharoenchai, M.Sc. 149 pages.

This descriptive research was to determine factors affecting the stress of the senior Primary School students. The Population were 130 students of senior primary school in Watwisadkarn, Bangkok Noi District, Bangkok Metropolitan. The methods used for data collections were composed of three questionnaires on personal, family and social support factors; and two assessment questionnaires on stress levels, and coping behavior and their relating questionnaires. The data then was computerized with a statistical program to find out percentage, mean, the standard deviation, Chi – square Test and Pearson’s Product Moment Correlation Coefficient.

The important results of this research were found that the Students of senior primary school in Watwisadkarn School had moderate stress at the percentage of 38.5, and moderate coping behavior and their relating at the percentage of 45.4. The study on relationships between the students’ stress and various factors found that the students’ health problems were related to the levels of stress, and gender study performances and exercise were related to the coping behavior and their relating; and they had a statistical significance level of .05. Family factors on mother’s income were related to levels of stress, and it had the same statistical significance level of .05. The social support had no statistical significance difference.
