

Oraphun Phromchoeiteera, Major 2006: Factors Affecting Health Promotion Behaviors of Student Nurses: A Case Study of Royal Thai Army Nurse. The Objective of this survey research was to determine factors affecting health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse. Sample were 279 personnels of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse. The research instrument was the questionnaire developed by the researcher. The data analyses were made for percentage, arithmetic mean, standard deviation and Pearson's Product Moment Correlation Coefficient.

The results were as follows: 1) The health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse were at a moderate level. 2) Predisposing factors namely knowledge had not relationships with health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse but Predisposing factors namely attitude, perceived benefit and perceived self-efficacy of health promotion had relationships with health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse with statistic significance at the level of 0.01. 3) Enabling factors namely resources for support health promotion had relationships with health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse with statistic significance at the level of 0.05. 4) Reinforcing factors namely receiving of health information from medias social support and receiving of suggestion on the behavior from family teacher friend had relationships with health promotion behaviors of Student Nurses of Royal Thai Army Nurse with statistic significance at the level of 0.01.
