The population and the sample were 25 provincial and district/subdistrict supervisors, 308 school administrators, and 308 academic teachers. The instruments used were questionaires, interview forms, and document analysis forms.

Research findings were as follows: 1. The majority of supervisors, school administrators and academic teachers agreed with using popular wisdom for curriculum development. Popular wisdom which mostly used for curriculum development to suit local needs and situations was local occupations. It was specifically used for the improve-

ment of teaching-learning or supplementary activities by inviting local handicraftsmen and village technicians to participate in curriculum development. 2. The problems faced by supervisors, school administrators and

academic teachers in using the popular wisdom for curriculum development were that the allocated budget was inadequate, no due support on policy, supervision and follow up activities was made; and the lack of clear understanding in how to utilize popular wisdom for curriculum development, and how modify and develop curriculum to suit local needs and situations.
