The purposes of this study were to investigate state and problems in organizing and managing the sport competition of Royal Thai Arms Forces, and to compare the opinions of team managers, and athletes in each Arms Force and to compare the opinions among the organizing committee, team manager and athletes towards those state and problems. Questionnaires were constructed and sent to 77 of organizing committee, 96 of team managers, and 434 of athletes concerned with the sports competition of Royal Thai Arms Forces. The returned questionnaires accounted for 92.20, 100, and 96 percent. respectively. The collecting data were analyzed into percentages, means, standard deviations and One-Way analysis of Variance. If there was any significant difference, the Scheffe's method was used as the follow up test.

The result indicated that :

1. The organizing committee, team managers and athletes had opinions about the overall state in organizing and managing the sport competition of Royal Thai Arms Forces at the high level of objectives and the high level of problems in state of organizing competition, budget and facilities but the low level of problems in personnel.

2. There were mostly significant differences at the .05 level among opinion of team managers in each Force.

3. There were almost significant differences at the .05 level among the opinion of athletes in each Force except the area of state in organizing and managing the sport competition.

4. There were almost significant differences at the .05 level among the opinion of organizing committee, team managers and athletes in the area of objectives and problems in organizing and managing sport competition. The opinion of the organizing committee and team managers were significantly different in the area of objectives. The opinion of the team managers and athletes were significantly different in the problems and managing sport.
