The purpose of this research was to study state and problems of safety education management of elementary schools and schools under the Project of Opportunity Expansion for Basic Education, Educational Region Eight.

Six hundred and four questionnaires constructed by the researcher were sent to school administrators and teachers responsible for safety education task in elementary schools and schools under the Project of Opportunity Expansion for Basic Education, Educational Region Eight. Five hundred and sixty questionnaires, accounted for 93.83 percent were returned. The data were then, analyzed in terms of percentages, means, and standard deviations.

The results were as follows:

1. Both elementary schools and schools under the Project of Opportunity Expansion for Basic Education, had conducted safety education management. Most of those schools had no fire ladders, no fire extinguishers, no fire drill, no gymnasiums and not having teachers in charge of first aid rooms.
2. Insufficient of financial support was the only problem in safety education management perceived at the high level by school administrators in elementary schools and schools under the Project of Opportunity Expansion for Basic Education. Teachers responsible for safety education tasks in elementary schools perceived the problems at the high level in two areas, they were the insufficient of financial support and administrating the safety program, while teachers in schools under the Project of Opportunity Expansion for Basic Education perceived the problem only the insufficient financial support at the high level.
