

Nuttida Thongpan 2006: The Democratic Political Culture: A Case Study of Political Science Student, Thammasat University. The objectives of the study were to investigate the political culture as democracy of undergraduates student faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University; to compare the political culture difference as the democracy; and the find out the relationship between the political training and political culture as democracy. The 272 undergraduates students of Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University were the sample of study. The questionnaire was the instrument of the study which processing data by SPSS. The percentage, mean, standard deviation, t-test, F-test and Pearson's correlation coefficient were as the statistical analysis, the significant level was .05.

The result the study found that majority of graduates students of Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University has less political training, the political culture has moderate level. On the other hand, the factors effected the political culture as democracy of graduates students of Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University were sex, income per month and academic years. The domicile factor was no effected the political cultures as democracy of graduates students of Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University. Also the political training has relationship with the political culture as democracy.
