This thesis aims to study the fictions of Phanom Nanthaphrueg, written between 1977-1986, as community culture discourses to attack the government's development discourses.

The study finds that the fictions of Phanom Nanthaphrueg attack the government's development discourses emphasizing on the concept of capitalistic economy. They reveal the government's hegemonic policy on the rural by presenting the rural as 'underdeveloped' areas that must be improved. The fictions also present government officials and traders as opportunists who look down upon local wisdom as the underdeveloped.

The fictions of Phanom Nanthaphrueg attack the above-mentioned discourses by presenting the detrimental effect of development on the rural people. Thus, they have to fight against government officials and traders since these people take advantages of them. Furthermore, the fictions narrate the simple folkways of living and self-reliance using local wisdom, self-sufficiency and community networks. It is clearly seen that the themes and concepts of the fictions agree with the concept of community culture apparent in the 1970s.

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
