

Arisa Sinthu 2011: Relationships between Family Relation and Health Behavior Substance Abuse Among Higher Secondary Education Students of the Demonstration School of Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University, Bangkok. Master of Science (Health Education), Major Field: Health Education, Department of Physical Education. Thesis Advisor: Associate Professor Supat Teravecharoenchai, M.Sc. 138 pages.

The objectives of this research were to determine family relationships with drug use behavior of high school students of the Demonstration School of Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University. The Samples were 202 grade 10-12 students. The data were collected by questionnaires which were analyzed by percentages, mean, standard deviation correlation coefficient Pearson.

The results showed that the family relationship in the students' role with family members was at a high level. The family relationship in terms of commitment and supports of family members and family relationship in parenting characteristics of the parents and guardians was at the medium level. Levels of knowledge about drug abuse of students was almost high level at 88.51. Attitudes about drug abuse of students were at the medium level. The level of students' drug use behaviors was at the medium level. Moreover, the family relationship of parents and guardians' parenting styles correlated with attitudes about drug use behaviors in statistically significantly at .05 level. The family relationship in the students' role with their family members, the commitment and the supporting of the family members, and the parenting styles of parents and guardians were related to drug use behavior were statistically significantly at .05 level.
