The Thai Constitution 1997 have been increased the rights of the alleged in many ways, the main purposed to protect the alleged's rights and the problem is something's they don't know their rights and because of this problem lead to law sue against the police officer

The main objectives of this research are;

- 1. to study the alleged's knowledge about the alleged rights concerning Thai Constitution 1997
- 2. to study the free variable such as the general characteristic and the interested in information of the alleged affect to the alleged's knowledge.

The 385 targets population defined from the Taro Yamane theory are accidental sampling and quota sampling

Data collection was done by questionnaires have been to test and reliability. Statistical techniques used in data analysis are frequencies, percentage, mean, standard deviation, t-test and F-test. The significant level was set at 0.05

The findings are;

- 1. The alleged in the area of The Metropolitan Police Division 3 have the medium level of knowledge about their rights and they also wants more information about their rights by television and radio
- 2. Education and income have statistically significant effects on the alleged's knowledge about the alleged rights.
