### **Abstract**

The aim of this research is to analyse Kant's philosophy of education and investigate whether his view on this subject is consistent with his overall philosophy.

The result of this research shows that Kant's philosophy of education is consistent with his ethics and social philosophy as they all share the same end, that is, making moral man and good society.

Kant divides education into two: physical education and moral or practical education. The former emphasizes on nurturing and discipline with the aim to restrain animal instincts. While the latter emphasizes acting in accordance with the moral law and making a moral child. According to this research, it can be concluded that there clearly is systematic unity in Kant's thoughts.

And his division of physical education and practical education is consistent with his view that man or human nature is to be taken in a twofold sense, namely as animal nature and rational nature.
