

Research Title : A Survey of Bachelor's Opinions for the Factors Affecting Employment : A Case Study of the 24<sup>th</sup> Bachelor Degree in Faculty of Business Administration.

#### Abstract

The purposes of the research were (1) to study the job of the 24<sup>th</sup> Bachelor Degree in Faculty of Business Administration. (2) to survey of Bachelor's opinions for the factors affecting employment.

The factors affecting employment led to curriculum the role of government, education systems, new technology and the component of their Bachelor's, such as education, family status, as classified by their personal background.

Sample used were 1000. The 889 questionnaires (88.9%) were returned. The instrument used for collection data was personal background with rating Scale Bachelor's opinion for a factors affecting employment.

Data were analyzed by the SPSS computer program and presented in terms of percentage, Mean Standard Deviation, The comparison of opinions made use of the t - test, F - test and Scheffe Procedure comparison Strategy.

The results indicated that the Bachelor's opinion for the factors affecting employment, economics, education system and course of study, new technology and education is more level. The Bachelor's opinions for a factors

affecting employment were significant different at .05 as classified by subject. The role of government was significant different at .05 as classified by sexes. Status of family was significant different at .05 as classified by earn. The characteristic Bachelor's was significant different at .05 as classified by domicile by birth and subject.
