More over for the objective of this research was for study the constitutional mechanism to solve the problem of corruption.

The method used in this study the way of work came from research reports, government documents, theses, books and case study.

The causes of corruption that due to the source of social, economic and

political and the source of law and it has four patterns, there are direct bribes, wealthy exceptional, influence of political and the officers have a share in the organized crime.

The effects of corruption that make to be bad result of the economic, social administration and political. The obstructions of the mechanism to solve the problem was the means of researching for bribing officials in bureaucratic for punished.

The mechanism of the constitution to solve the problem of corruption has four measures there are 1. showing the properties and liabilities account 2. to establish the National Counter Corruption Commission (NCCC) 3. dismissal from the status and 4. prosecute the politician.

The result of the study shows that the mechanism of the constitution to solve the problem of corruption is a method to solve that. Constitution also provided more power to the National Counter Corruption Commission (NCCC) and provisioned of the law to punished the bribing officials. Also the method will solve and decrease moderately the corruption.
