The objectives of this study are to search for motivating factor affecting an efficiency of the task performance of 1st BN Special Operation (Commando) Air Force and its performance.

The sample of the study comprises of 70 selected officers from 1st BN Special Operation (Commando) Air Force. The data were collected by using questionnaires and analyzed by using percentage, Chi -- Square test, and Cramer's V.

The research findings are as follows.

1. Efficiency of task performance officers from 1st BN Special Operation (Commando) Air Force level is relatively high.

2. Motivating factors affecting efficiency of task performance are found to be the opportunity for promotion and the return benefit, which have significant relationship with efficiency of task performance.

Other factors, such as project participation, training, age, education, income, position and years of services have no significant relationship with efficiency of task performance.
