## ABSTRACT

The study aims to survey the use of the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package in the secondary school in the central area and education region 5 under the jurisdiction of the General Education Department, Ministry of Education. The goals of the research were as follows: (1) to study the status of the use of the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package; (2) to study problems and problems solving related to the use of the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package; and (3) to study the need for cooperation among groups.

The results of the study can be summarized as follows: (1) most school libraries  $(\overline{X} = 3.98)$  used the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package to create databases of book cataloges periodical indexes, and biographies; (2) a few school libraries  $(\overline{X} = 2.70)$  had some problems in using the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Program, especially in the area of data transfer  $(\overline{X} = 3.25)$ ; there were failures in searches for needed items

 $(\overline{X} = 2.70)$ , and of the program stopping while large quantities of data were being added to the database  $(\overline{X} = 2.60)$ , problems which most school libraries solved by self-help; (3) the school libraries desired future collaboration ( $\overline{X} = 4.04$ ) in using the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package to provide better and more extensive library services.

The study also revealed that : (1) library personnel holding bachelor degrees used the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package significantly more often than non-graduate staff ( $\alpha = .05$ ); (2) the rerationship between problems encountered in using the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS and the work positions of library personnel was non-significant ( $\alpha = .05$ ); (3) library personnel at different work positions shared the same opinion as to the desire ability of using the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package in the future( $\alpha = .05$ ); (4) the training of library personnel was not related to the utization of the Mini-Micro CDS/ISIS Package for library work.
