

SRIRUT CHANTRISOMWONGS : SCENARIOS OF THE RESIDENCE HALL OF CHULALONG KORN UNIVERSITY IN B.E. 2540. THESIS ADVISOR : PROF. SOMWUNG PITIYA NUWAT, Ph.D. AND MR. CHUMPOL POOLPATARACHEWIN, Ph.D. 263 pp.

The purpose of this study was to identify the future trends of Chulalongkorn University Residence Hall within the year 1997 by using EFR and EDFR techniques. The sample consisted of 34 Residence Hall experts which had been divided into 2 groups : 8 academicians and 26 practitioners. Questionnaire and interview were employed in this study. The obtained data were analyzed by means of content analysis, percentage, median, interquartile range and quantitative trends by moving average and the least square methods.

The study revealed that the Residence Hall would be financed and managed by the university in a non co-ed form, for both undergraduate and graduate students. Since the needs to stay in the Residence Hall is expected to increase, the selection process will still be necessary. Instead of this increasing, the rate of fees would be set up sufficiently, and the services and facilities were anticipated to have a better quality. The participation and cooperation among faculties would be increased, as well. Residence Hall supervisors or their assistants tend to be Chulalongkorn lecturer elected to be in charge in the same way as the present.

In the future, Residence Hall will be directed toward the facilitation of learning opportunities, experiences and extra-curricular activities which are not taught in classroom. This will be able to help the students to have good characteristics of leaders and followers as needed. However, the interaction among the students may decrease. Besides, an average proportion between candidates and students selected to stay will be 2.0 - 2.5 times. Enrollments of the freshmen and the graduates tend to increase. At the same time, the percentage of freshmen in dormitory and rent house will greatly increase.
