teachers' behavior according to the 1987 minimum criteria for instructional improvement under the office of Mae Hong Son Provincial. Primary Education. The study's samples were 1987 students and teachers in Prathom Suksa 4. There were altogether 409 students and 22 teachers from 20 schools. The data were collected by observing students' and teachers' behavior; examining students' physical, teachers' workload records.; interviewing; and using standardized test from The Ministry of Education in Thai and Mathematics. The results

- 1. Teachers' behavior: the research showed that the teachers met the minimum criteria for instructional improvement at high level.

 The details were as follow:

 1.1 Appropriateness in Information Report. The teachers
- followed the minimum criteria at high level. Every school teachers had information report activities everyday. Considering its sequence of steps it found that all schools teachers missed the step of information analysis.
- 1.2 Lesson plan following: The teachers practiced at low level because they had not prepared lesson plan, they were short of system lesson planning. In teaching learning style it found that some schools organised students in group but work individually.
