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Abstract

The purpose of this study was to investigate angry behavior and their causes of Pratomsuksa VI Students, Anuban Lopburi School, Changwat Lopburi. The subjects were 50 boys and 50 girls enrolled in the third term during the 1988 academic year. They were drawn by stratified random sampling technique. The data were collected by structured interview and analysed by using Frequency counts and percentage.

The results showed:

- 1 The students performed 9 types of angry behavior.

 Quiet was of the highest percentage, 33.06. Next to it
 were scolding 26.61, hitting someone 16.13, sullenness
 8.06, accusing 5.65, petulance 4.84 and waking away 2.42
 respectively. Hitting somthing that caused angry behavior
 and crying were of the lowest percentage, 1.61.
- 2 The causes of angry behavior were found to be combination. It was found that:
- 2.1 Quiet was the combination among various causes. The high percentages were being annoyed and being ridiculed by friends with 34.15 and 24.39 percent respectively.
- 2.2 Scolding, the second highest of angry behavior, was caused mostly by being incooperated in group activities, being rediculed and being annoyed by friends, and conflict among friends with 24.24, 18.18, 18.18 and 18.18 percent respectively.
