A studying on Part II: Formation of Contract of the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods which focuses on the text and law enforcement in order to compare with Thai law applicable to the formation of contract in the international sale of goods, ie. the Civil and Commercial Code; particularly Juristic Acts, Contract and Sale. The result of this research is that most of the rules on offer and acceptance of the both laws are similar.

Should Thailand want to be a member of the Convention, it should consider on the matter of revocation of an offer with fixed time for acceptance and should enact a law similar to the provision of the Convention in order to take more advantage than to choose one way on the other. And on the issue of modifying acceptance. Thai law should not have provision for enforcing this matter directly, because there are many ways to achieve justice for parties. To enact law in one way or the other may rigidify the law enforcement.
