

Thesis Title : A COMPARATIVE STUDY OF THE DESIRABLE CHARACTERISTICS,
THE PERFORMANCE AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE RESULTS BETWEEN
TWO GROUPS OF THE PRIMARY SCHOOL PRINCIPALS WHO HAD
BEEN SELECTED BY DIFFERENT METHODS IN CHANGWAT KALASIN

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ABSTRACT

The research objectives were to evaluate and compare on the administrative characteristics, the performance, and the administrative results of the primary school principals who were selected to assume the positions by two different methods_ by written examination and training, and by normal selection (no written examination and training). The sampling included 62 school principals of each group, and 302 assistants and teachers of those selected sampling schools by using cluster technique. The developed rating scale questionnaires were used for collecting data. The earned data were computerized for determining percentage, arithmetic means, standard deviation, and t-test.

The Results :

1. The school principals of both groups had "good" characteristics, worked "much" for their duties and had "much" administrative behavior, the teachers had "good" morale and the students received "good" achievement as the results of their administrative work.

2. No compared pairs on the administrative characteristics, the performance, and on the administrative results were statistically different at .05 level of significance; except the normal selected principals who had better personality than the principals who assumed their positions by taking examination and training.
