VINEEKARN SELEPARUSMI : THE EFFECT OF GROUP COUNSELING ON INCRFASING
NURSING CARING BEHAVIOR OF FIRST - YEAR NURSING STUDENTS
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The purpose of this research was to study the effect of group counseling on increasing caring behavior of the first-year nursing students. The subjects were 16 first-year nursing students from Boromrajchonnee Narathiwat Nursing College who volunteered to participate in the experiment. The experimental group attended Ohlsen group counseling for two hours, twice a week, during the period of 5 weeks which made approximately 20 hours. The control group was given no condition. This research used the ABF control groups design. Data were collected through the time interval observation of nursing caring behavior. The data were analyzed by the analysis of variance with repeated measures. When significant differences were found, either Tukey method or t-test method was used to analyze the differences between the pairs.

Results showed that

1. Caring behavior of the nursing students who recieved group counseling increased significantly higher than those in the control group at .05 level.
2. Caring behavior of the nursing students attended group counseling during the treatment and the follow up phase increased significantly higher than those during the baseline phase at the .05 level.
3. Caring behavior in the treatment phase and the follow up phase of the experimental group had no significant differences at the .05 level.

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
