Title : THE EFFECT OF GROUP COUNSELING ON THE ADAPTATION

OF STUDENTS WHOSE PARENTS INFECTED WITH AIDS

The purpose of this research was to compare the adaptation of students whose parents infected with AIDS, between the treated and non-treated by group counseling. The experimental group are students whose parents infected with AIDS of Ban Rong Sarn School, Chiang Kham Primary Educational'S Office Phayao Province. Twelve subjects were chosen from the lowest score running in adaptation questionnaire. The subjects were divided in two groups, first six for experimental group and six for control group one was the eclectic group Counseling Program, which the program based on Client - Centered Theory and other. The eclectic group counseling program was available to the treated group for 12 sessions: while lasted for 6 successive week and each session lasted for 60 minutes, t-test was utilized for analysis of the data.

The result of this research, the students whose parents infected with AIDS: treated group counseling by were statistically significant higher on students whose parents with AIDS. Than the non-treated at the .01, and treated group counseling also reported that the group gave them more benefits. They had opportunity to survey their selves and mind, share the idea, brave to face the problem and accept the truth of life under the atmosphere of each other acceptance. It also made them feel warm and save, know their selves better, and have the ways to go on, and the last ability to stand on their own two legs in the future.
