The objective of thesis is to study various factors affecting the success of economic sanctions by using the economic sanctions against South Africa's Apartheid during 1985-1993 as a case study.


The study found that many coercive measures, especially the banning of finance, banking and investment, caused great damages to South Africa's economy. These measures were the main factors that could force South African government to terminate its apartheid. However, there are some other contributory factors which were very helpful to the success of economic sanctions. These factors are : a good vision of a white leader of South Africa; the end of cold war; the international human right campaign; the responsive actions of youths and students; the economic decline and deteriorating social conditions of South Africa. It is also found that international cooperation in these economic sanctions were very strong, especially the cooperation of South Africa's main trading partners : the United States of America and the European community
