The purpose of this thesis was to study the same sex intimate friendships of preadolescent with different sex and sex roles.

Results of this study are as follows

- 1. Female preadolescents show significant higher same-sex intimate friendships scores than male preadolescents. (p < .01)
 - 2. Male preadolescents with different sex roles had significant differences in same sex intimate friendships. (p < .01) Moreover, male preadolescents with androgyny had the highest same-sex intimate friendships scores, followed by feminine, masculine and undifferentiated groups respectively.
 - 3. Female preadolescents with different sex roles had significant differences in same sex intimate friendships. (p < .01) Female preadolescents with androgyny had higher same-sex intimate friendships scores than undifferentiated group. However, the scores of female preadolescents with androgyny, feminine and masculine groups did not differ significantly.
 - 4. Male preadolescents with androgyny show significant differences in same sex intimate friendships scores from female preadolescents. (p < .01)
