The purpose of this research was to study identity status of late adolescence in higher educational institutes. The subjects of this research were 160 college students: 80 males and 80 females. Data was collected by interviewing in tape recorder. In collecting the data the Marcia et al's identity status interview was used.

The findings were as follows:

- 1. Numbers of students had occupational identity achievement status increased in accordance with class levels at less than .01 level of significance.
- 2. Numbers of students had political identity achievement status did not increased in accordance with class levels at .05 level of significance.
- 3. Numbers of students had religious identity achievement status did not increased in accordance with class levels at .05 levels of significance.
- 4. Numbers of students had sex-role identity achievement status increased in accordance with class levels at .05 levels of significance.
- 5. Numbers of students had sexuality identity achievement status increased in accordance with class levels at .01 levels of significance.
- 6. Numbers of students had ego identity achievement status increased in accordance with class levels at .05 levels of significance.
