The purposes of this research were to study and compare the adjust adjustment problems and mental health of health education teachers in the secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Education between the Education Region five and Bangkok Metropolis. The samples were 250 subjects randomly selected from health education teachers in the secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Educational Region five and 212 subjects randomly selected from Bangkok Metropolis. The Mooney Problem Check List Adult Form and Symtom Check List-90 were used to measure adjustment problems and mental health. Questionnaires were returned, accounted for 74.46 percent. The data were analyzed in terms of percentage, means, standard deviation and t-test.

Results of the study were as follows:

1. The health education teachers in secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Educational Region five and Bangkok Metropolis had problems of adjustment at the low level on the following

problems: health, economic security, self improvement, personality, home and family, courtship and sex, religion and occupation.

2. The health education teachers in the secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Educational Region five and Bangkok Metropolis had problems of mental health at the normal level on the following problems: somatization obsessive-compulsive, interpersonal

sensitivity, depression, anxiety, hostility, phobic anxiety, paranoid indeation and psychoticism.

3. There were statistically significant differences at the .05 level between health education teachers in the secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Educational Region five and

level between health education teachers in the secondary schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Educational Region five and Bangkok Metropolis on the adjustment problems only about the health areas.

4. There were no statistically significant difference at the .05
