ABSTRACT

The purposes of this investigation were to find out reasons, motivation, and campaign techniques for election and work behavior of the teachers' representatives in the Provincial Khurusapha Committee; and to investigate the concerned personnel's opinions towards the Provincial and District Khurusapha Committee B.E. 2531. The sample of the study was comprised of 5 provincial educational administrators, 5 provincial primary educational directors, 78 Teachers' representatives, and 546 Khurusapha's members. Three sets of questionnaires were developed to collect data. Approximately ninety percent of the administered questionnaires were obtained. The earned data were then analysed by a computer program to find percentage, arithmetic mean, and standard deviation.

Findings

1. Reasons and motivation of the Khurusapha's representatives for election were to protect and preserve the members' benefit, to help solve the members' problems, to supervise the Provincial Khurusapha's mission, to raise their prestige, and to preserve the encouragement for election aroused by some Khurusapha's members.

2. The most observed campaign techniques were : using the posters, the leaflets, personal contact, the candidates' promise to help solve the members' problems, asking the office heads and Khurusapha's members to help campaign. The least used techniques were providing money and value materials.

3. Acceptable work experiences, good human relationship, honesty, clearly announced policy, having ideally social concern, having self-confidence, were among the members' reasons for electing their representatives. The least reason for electing was closely personal relation.

4. The respondents perceived many aspects of representatives' pre-and post-election positive behavior such as effective regular work performance, getting along with staff and chief, having highly social concern, and performing regular mission honestly. After election, the representatives moderately performed their mission concerning teacher's working standard, preserving teachers' benefit, service, academic, and so on. In attending the meetings, the representatives properly expressed their decision making relying on rules and regulations, social concerns and carefully accepted members' benefit.

5. Most of the Khurusapha's members accepted the Provincial and District Khurusapha Committee B.E. 2531 except the methods of voting by openly raising hand.
