Moreover, both English and American Gothic Literature intends to teach a moral lesson, as well as, to entertain by making readers frightened and excited by the supernatural beings. The approach to the study by the theory of escape illustrates on the ways in which characters escape in literature, which are classified in two kinds of escape: "External Escape" and "Internal Escape".

American Gothic characters experience a feeling of alienation and a psychic break down. The American Gothic character is the archetypal character for modern literature of the nineteenth century. Gothic Literature is similar to Romantic Literature and Historical Romance. It became the inspiration for

future authors to create new kind of literature such as New Gothic Literature

and Science fiction.
