

Thesis Title Job Satisfaction of Health Education Teachers
 in Secondary Schools in Bangkok Metropolis as
 Perceived by Themselves

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ABSTRACT

The purposes of this research were to study the level of job satisfaction of health education teachers in secondary schools in Bangkok Metropolis and to compare job satisfaction of health education teachers between those who worked in private secondary schools and those who worked in public secondary schools. The questionnaires were sent to 416 health education teachers and 366 or 88.83 percent of questionnaires were returned. The obtained data were then analyzed in terms of percentages, means, standard deviations. The t-test was also employed to determine the level of significant difference.

It was found that :

1. The overall job satisfaction of health education teachers in secondary schools in Bangkok Metropolis were at the high level. The nine factors considered at the high level were the interpersonal relation with peers and superiors, the recognition, the work security and safety, the work status,

the responsibility, the work achievement, the work itself, the work policy and administration, and the work environment, respectively. The two factors considered at the low level were the salary and fringe benefit, and the professional advancement, respectively.

2. The comparison on the overall job satisfaction of health education teachers between those who worked in the private secondary schools and those who worked in public secondary schools showed no significant difference at .05 level. Nevertheless, when comparing among factors, the interpersonal relation with peers and superiors, the responsibility, the work achievement, and the professional advancement showed significant difference at .05 level.
