The purpose of this reseach is to find out appropriate measures to supervise the execution of Court judgement of Prime Minister's order in the disputed cases between the Government Agencies (and other Public Bodies) and the private sectors, regardless they win or lose the cases.

As a result, it is found that where the judgement of the Court has been pronounced against the Government Agencies (and other Public Bodies), it has been accepted and complied with in a whole. But where the judgement is in favour of those agencies, they usually neglect the execution of judgement against the private sectors. It is therefore necessary that some public laws should be amended to ensure the effectiveness and efficiency of its execution. Furthermore, the government should pass internal joint regulation prescribing cooperation among the agencies concerning the enforcement of judgement of the Court. Finally, there should be a restructuring of the Legal Execution Department and the Office of the Attorney General under the same organization to ensure the unity of works.

Regarding the execution of Prime Minister's order to the claims of citizen against the State, no process nor organization resposible for supervision has been established. There should be an amendment of the law concerning the Office of the Judicial Council: regulation and organization, which empower it more effectively to follow the enforcement of the said order.
