The purposes of this research were to study and to make a comparison of the application of learning experiences from health education courses in daily life of Lower Secondary students in schools under the Jurisdiction of the Department of General Education, Bangkok Metropolis in accordance with sex variables. The questionnaires were sent to 408 Mathayom Suksa (one, two and three) students. The group of sample was 204 male and 204 female students. Almost all questionnaires, accounted for 99.5 percent, were returned. The data were then analyzed to obtain arithmetic means, and standard deviations. The t-test was applied to determine the significant differences between means.

Findings were as follows :

1. Most learning experiences from health education courses were applied in students' daily life very often, except recording their own health history, helping the victim who stop breathing with Cardio Pulmolnary Resuscitation (CPR), first aids for the victim with fainting, heat stroke and epilepsy, transportation of the victim, reporting the public health officer when communicable disease persons were found and massage the gum with hand after brushing teeth .
2. There were no statistically significant differences at .05 level between male and female students in the application of learning experiences from health education courses in daily life.
