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URBAN AND REGIONAL PLANNING CURRICULUM

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The objective of this research was the analysis of Urban and Regional Planning Curriculum concentrating on the opinion of instructors, students, graduates and their supervisors regarding the curriculum and instruction and graduates' ability in working. The findings were as follow:

The participants agreed with the objectives of Urban and Regional Planning Curriculum. However, they pointed that credits and contents of the required courses were taught more than credit-hour that specified. The contents were relevant to Thai society and they were very useful for implementation except a course in Transportation and Practicum in planning. Textbooks in the library and poor classroom environments were stated as problems of instruction.

According to the comparision of opinions between graduates and graduates' supervisors, the results showed that graduate supervisors at their places of work rated that they were capable in working higher than the graduated rated themselves, especially in human relationship, personality, inquiry and ability in working which were rated significantly differenes.
