Civil execution is the procedure to support and enforce every judgement to be effective. This procedure should be convenient, time and cost saving, as well as fair for both parties and all related people.

In this thesis, the author studied and analyzed the provisions of civil executional system of foreign countries, ie, England, United States of America, France, and Germany. By comparing these foreign provisions with the one of Thailand, the differences exist in many aspects. The major finding is that the law of Thailand does not provide convenience, time and cost saving nor justice to both parties and related people up to the level that it should have been.

The suggestion is that the various procedures be set up in addition to solve the correct problems of both the principal of law and its practice, by taking foreign laws into consideration as guidelines.

Finally, the author summarized the analysis on the comparative basis and proposed the direction to improve the procedure of execution, addressing on institutions, personnels, processes and procedures, as well as the evaluation in term of pros and cons.

The author believed that all of these efforts can express willingness to push the law of Thailand regarding the civil executional system towards the objective of the civil law.
