The purpose of this research is to study the difference of self-esteem of adolescents with different sex-role perception.

The results of the study are as follow:

- 1. Adolescents with androgyny sex-role perception show a significant higher self-esteem scores than adolessents with feminine sex-role perception and adolescents with undifferentiated sex-role perception but didn't show significant differences in self-esteem scores of adolescents with musculine sex-role perception.
- 2. Adolescents with undifferentiated sex-role perception show a significant lower self-esteem scores than adolescents with androgyny sex-role perception and adolescents with musculine sex-role perception but didn't show significant differences in self-esteem scores of adolescents with feminine sex-role perception.
- 3. Male adolescents with musculine sex-role perception show a significant higher self-esteem scores than male adolescents with feminine sex-role perception and male adolescents with undifferentiated sex-role perception but didn't show significant differences in self-esteem scores of male adolescents with androgyny sex-role perception.
- 4. Female adolescents with musculine sex-role perception show a significant higher self-esteem scores than female adolescents with undifferentiated sex-role perception but didn't show significant differences in self-esteem scores of female adolescents with androgyny sex-role perception and female adolescents with feminine sex-role perception.
