Political Parties are political institutions which involved in promotion and developing of democracy and are a bureau which can take the people's desire to set up policy for managing country, but for Thailand since the revolution from absolute monarchy to democracy in 1932, the right for political freedom concerning setting up Political Parties was written in Thailand's Constitution of 1955. This right was ratified in every constitution even in the 1968 Act of Political Parties, 1974 and 1981 respectively and also the Act of Political Parties in 1974 and 1981 too.

However, since there have been many revolutions in Thailand, the Thai Political Parties can not develop to be stabled "political institutions", including the setting up too many Political Parties and there is not any Political Party which has gained enough votes for majority in forming a government alone. This are reasons in forming a coalition government in which no stability.

However, the movements to establish the Political Party system in Thailand to be less in parties but large in size by making conditions in the 1978 constitution for the Thai Kingdom and the 1981 Act of Political Parties for example there must be at least 5,000 members through out the country in order to set up a Political Party, a member can be bounced from Political Party, etc. But it appeared that the legal measures were not successful.

Therefore, the researcher's opinion is to rewrite the constitution for the Thai Kingdom of 1978 by changing the election system from "split zones/ split votes" to "one zone-one vote", Political Parties should combine to each others, and establishment registration office of Political Party which is in the parliament's responsibility, and also government should provide supporting funds to Political Parties.
