The objective of the study was to evaluate the vocational training programs in apprentice schools under the jurisdiction of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration.

The study revealed that :

Regarding context evaluation, the programs under study were responsive to economic and social demands, needs of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration and people. As for input evaluation, approximately half of the interviewees responded that the programs obtained adequate resources. The resources and curriculum were appropriate. From process evaluation, it was found that most of the interviewees did not participate in program formulation but participated in curriculum development. The process also included making work schedule, supervision by administrators, appropriate measurement and evaluation, and follow-ups using reports and questionnaire. Instruction was practice-oriented.

As for product evaluation, the achieved objectives were maximizing the use of resources available, provision of knowledge and vocational skills for the educationally disadvantaged and interested people so that they could earn their living and also possess ethical values. The objectives that were not fully achieved were providing adequate vocational courses for the target groups mentioned above as well as elementary and secondary students. Also, the establishment of vocational schools was lower than the target in the educational plan under Bangkok Metropolitan Administration.
