The purpose of this research was to analyze the nursing student activities enhancing morality aspects in nursing colleges under the jurisdiction of Nursing College Division, Department of Public Health, Ministry of Public Health.

Researchemethodology: was composed of two stages. The first was the stage of developing conceptual framework. Morality aspects for nurses were reviewed by the researcher then were validated by experts. The second was the stage of research methodology. In this stage, data were collected through documents analysis and questionnaire then they were analyzed by using percentage.

The findings showed that : the morality aspects which frequently found in documents analysis were co-operation, health behavior, and sacrifice while in student activities the morality aspects found in each activities as follows: Religion activities enhancing the religion belief, responsibility, and self-conciousness, while academic activities enhancing the studiousness, responsibility, and intelligent. Political activities enhancing rationalization, respectfulness in human right, and intelligent. Cultural activities enhancing co-operation, gentle, and discipline. Natural and environment conservation activities enhancing responsibility, rationalization, and sacrifice while sporting activities, recreation activities, and community service rendering activities they were all enhancing co-operation, responsibility, and sacrifice. The sacrificing, the generousity, the kindness, and the responsibility were enhanced by other activities. Findings concluded that the morality aspects which mostly found in nursing student activities were responsibility, sacrifice, and co-operation.
