Customs Acts are the law that indicate liabilities result from "Mala prohibita" for it has been provided to be penalty. Customs Acts have been significant for country development, thus it is to be enforced and effective to violators. Especially customs evasion liability as provided in article 27 that has to be criminally liable with a high punishment which is suppressed absolutely is considered to be economic crime by the government nowadays.

The research is found that some of the offenders about Customs Acts, in this case, which result from the extensive and equivocal provisions of Customs Acts about offenders follow article 27 B.E. 2469 cause the justice proceedings' organization interpret the law in restriction. So it can make the offenders lack of fear of law.

Therefore, it should be improved the law above to be patent, and justice proceedings' organization is able to apply the law about punishing the offenders according to spirit of law. Because it will prevent and suppress all offenders efficiently and effectively.
