

Kasem Sungpirom 2011: The Study of Language Usage in Commanding Codes of the Police Radio Communication. Master of Arts (Thai Language), Major Field: Thai Language, Department of Thai Language. Thesis Advisor: Assistant Professor Boonlear Jaimanoo, Ph.D. 191 pages.

The thesis was devoted to study the use of language with transformational theory in commanding codes of police radio communication. Keeping in view of characteristic of language usage on the used of word, sentence pattern, process of communication, and analyzing of language usage with transformational theory, the following studied have been under taken on 56 data of commanding codes of police radio communication.

Results obtained in the present work regarding the used of word showed that the word usage gave a result of 5 types of word usage. They were (1) shortening the word (2) using an abbreviation (3) implicit word (4) duplicating and (5) using a technical terms, which implicit was the most used.

From the studied of sentence pattern, it was found that there were 3 types of communicating sentences. They were found (1) affirmative sentences (2) interrogative sentences and (3) commanding sentences. It was also found that the communicating objective could be divided into the ones which were objectives, and another which were not. The aimless sentences were demanding, commanding and informative sentences.

Further, studied on the process of communication thrown some light on the result of 10 characteristics. They were found (1) preparing before communicating (2) calling (3) replying (4) using numbers (5) sending a news (6) repeating (7) cancelling (8) incorrectly calling (9) emergency (10) informing, but receiving and connecting the messages did not played any role in this studied.

Howver, the analyzing of language usage with transformational theory in commanding codes of police radio communication has been shown that there were 44 sentence structures.
