

Purposes of this research are to study the decision-making method and the problems in decision-making of secondary school administrators under the jurisdiction of the Department of General Education, Educational Region Six.

The findings were as follows : (1) Large secondary school administrators made decisions concerning the six administrative tasks; as academic, clerical, personnels, school survice affairs, school-community relation affairs, and general affairs; by way of problem discussion and estimated alternatives with their subordinates until the consensus was reached. (2) Medium secondary school administrators made their decision, concerning the general affairs; by way of problem discussion with their subordinates individually and then made the decision by themselves. They also made decision, concerning academic, clerical personnels and school-community relation affairs; by way of problem discussion and estimated alternatives with their subordinates until the consensus was reached. (3) Small secondary school administrators made their decision, concerning the clerical, personnels, school survice affairs, and general affairs; by way of problem discussion with their subordinates individually and then made the decision by themselves. They also made decision, concerning academic and school-community relation affairs; by way of problem discussion and estimated alternatives with their subordinates until the consensús was reached.

Problems in decision making were academic policy was not clear, Lack of information for decision making, Lack of administrators' self-confidence in personnel administration and limitation of communication in school survice and general affairs.
