

Thanapat Chanrueng 2013 : The Opinion of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration' s
Officials about Ethics of Local Politicians. Master of Arts (Political Science), Major Field:
Political Science, Department of Political Science and Public Administration.

The objectives of this research were to study the opinions of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration's officials about ethics of local politicians and to compare the difference of opinions according to related factors. The sample consisted of 296 officials. Data were collected by using questionnaires. Statistics employed for data analysis were percentage , mean , standard deviation , t - test , and one - way analysis of variance. The level of statistical significance was set at .05

The research found out that the level of opinions of the officials about ethics of local politicians was moderate. The highest score was that local politicians were Royal to nation , religion , monarchy , and democracy with the king as head of state. The lowest score was that local politicians intervened in the process of appointment , transferring , and promotion of officials. Hypotheses testing revealed that the difference in the position level , tenure , and access to political information of the officials caused the difference in their level of opinions about ethics. But the difference in sex , age , marital status , education level , income , and knowledge of local government did not cause any difference in their level of opinions.
