The purposes of this research were to study professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care in hospitals under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of University Affairs, and to study variables which would be able to predict the professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care. These variables were professional values and service traditional values, empathy, professional support among team members and nursing experience. Research samples consisted of 289 professional nurses, from medical and surgical wards. Data were collected by using questionnaires developed by the researcher. Stepwise Multiple Regression Analysis was used in the data analysis.

The major findings were as the followings:-

- 1. Professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosociol nursing care was in the lower level.
- 2. Empathy and professional support among team members, were positively and significantly correlated with professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care at the .05 level, whereas nursing experience was negatively and significantly related to professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care at the .05 level. There were no correlation between professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care and professional values and service traditional values.
- 3. The 3.99 per cent (R^2 = .0399) of variance in professional nurses' abilities in providing psychosocial nursing care were explained by empathy only.
