

CHAPTER FOUR

RESULTS

This chapter presents the data collected from the sampled grade 6 students in the 2008 academic year at St. Dominic School. The findings were interpreted to make conclusions related to need analysis of grade 6 students at St. Dominic School in learning English.

The purpose of this study was to explore grade 6 students' needs in learning English at a private school in Bangkok. The results of the study collected from the questionnaires of 190 respondents can be presented based on the objectives of the study mentioned earlier.

After SPSS Version 14.0 processed all the data collection, the results of the analysis was divided into two parts:

- 4.1 Respondents' general background information
- 4.2 Respondents' English needs

4.1 GENERAL BACKGROUND OF THE RESPONDENTS

The first part of the questionnaire sought the background data concerning age, current G.P.A and English abilities. The total number of respondents was 190 sampled grade 6 students in the 2008 academic year at St. Dominic School. All information was displayed in the form of frequency and percentage of the respondents as follows:

According to Table 1, most of the respondents were 12 years old with the frequency of 114 (60.0%). The next largest group was 11 years old with the frequency of 65 (34.2%), and the rest were 13 years old (4.2%) and 10 years old (1.6%). The average age of the respondents was 11.67.

According to Table 2, 27.4 percent of the students had a G.P.A. of more than 3.75. The second range of G.P.A. was between 3.51-3.75 with the frequency of 35 (18.4%), and the lowest frequency was 9 (4.7%) belonging to the students who had a G.P.A. of less than 2.50.

From Table 3, 47 % of the respondents rated their overall English abilities as fair, 28.4% of the respondents rated their overall English abilities as good, and only 8.9% of the respondents rated their overall English abilities as excellent.

4.2 ENGLISH LANGUAGE NEEDS

The second part of the questionnaire showed English language needs of grade 6 students at St. Dominic School. All information was displayed in the form of frequency and percentage of the respondents as follows:

As shown in table 4, most of the respondents needed to study English because of future careers (67.4%), followed by the need to study English because of further study (23.7%), no need to study English (5.8%) and need to study English because of personal interest (3.2%).

According to Table 5, about 61.1% of the respondents saw that using mostly English, with some Thai when necessary was the most appropriate language for instructors to use in class, 31.6% thought that the most appropriate language for instructors to use in class was mostly Thai, with some English when necessary, and only 2.6% viewed that English only was the most appropriate language for instructors.

As shown in Table 6, the most appropriate language for respondents' classmates to use in class was mostly Thai, with some English when necessary (47.9%), followed by mostly English, with some Thai when necessary (24.7%), Thai only (22.1%) and English only (5.3%).

According to Table 7, in terms of English instructors, most of the respondents preferred an equal number of Thai and native speaking instructors (61.1%) , followed by mostly native speaking instructors (14.2%) , all native speaking instructors (11.1%) , mostly Thai (10.5%) and all Thai (3.2%).

Most of the respondents preferred to study in large groups (more than 5 students) with the frequency of 72 (37.9%), followed by in small groups (3-4 students) with the frequency of 61 (32.1%), whereas only 19 respondents required to study in pairs (10.0%).

The majority of the respondents needed to study English 4 days per week (30.5%), followed by 3 days per week (26.3%), 5 days per week (22.1%), 2 days per week (13.7%) and 1 day per week (7.4%).

Most of the respondents needed to study English 60 minutes per day with the frequency of 50 (26.3%), followed by 45 minutes per day with the frequency of 43 (22.6%); however, only 25 respondents needed to study English 55 minutes per day (13.2%).

According to Table 12, the findings of the overall English skills to study English language were needed with high level with the average score of 3.86. They extensively needed listening skills the most with the score of 4.15. The second need was speaking skills with the score of 3.95 followed by reading skills with the score of 3.74. The respondents needed writing skills to study English language the least with the score of 3.62.

As shown in Table 13, it was found that the overall needs for speaking practice in English courses were extensively needed with the average score of 3.43. They extensively needed all skills as follows: correct accent, daily conversation asking and answering question, respectively ($\bar{x} = 3.97, 3.95, \text{ and } 3.75$). They moderately needed in making requests / making complaints, academic discussions and presentations, respectively. ($\bar{x} = 3.38, 2.86, 2.64$).

From Table 14, listening practice was extensively needed with the score of 3.75. Most of the respondents extensively needed listening practice in English courses in watching English soundtrack movies the most with the score of 4.12, followed by pronunciation, T.V. / VDO news, Daily conversation, and Songs with the score of 3.93, 3.88, 3.87, 3.62 and 3.49, respectively. Listening to English radio broadcasts was the least needed to practice with the score of 3.23 or 'moderate need'.

From Table 15, reading practice was extensively needed with the score of 3.42. Most of the respondents extensively needed reading practice in using an English-Thai Dictionary the most with the score of 3.67, followed by answering questions, reading for main idea, reading for information with the scores of 3.63, 3.63 and 3.54, respectively. Reading literature was the least needed in reading practice with the score of 3.13 or 'moderate need'.

As shown in Table 16, writing practice was extensively needed with the score of 3.45. Most of the respondents extensively needed writing e-mails/memorandums the most with the score of 3.57, followed by writing sentences, taking notes from teachers, writing dictation and writing for practicing in exercise book with the score of 3.52 , 3.48 , 3.47 and 3.47 , respectively. Taking notes from textbooks was the least needed practice with the score of 3.18 or ‘moderate need’.

As shown in Table 18, about 26.8% of the respondents would like to learn game, 19.5% sport, 8.9% adventure, 6.8% tourism or history, 6.3% hobbies or computer, 5.3% other, 4.7% food, 3.2% politics, 1.6% culture, 0.5% mobile phone or shopping.
