

ABSTRACT

Title of Research Paper : The Participation of Tambol Administrative Organization
 Members in Local Development Administration : A Case
 Study of Muang Nakornpathom District, Nakornpathom
 Province
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The study of "The Participation of Tambol Administrative Organization Members in Local Development Administration : A Case Study of Muang Nakornpathom District, Nakornpathom Province" had 3 follow objectives :

1. to study the participation level of Tambol Administrative Organization Members in Local Development Administration.
2. to study factors affecting the participation of Tambol Administrative Organization Members in Local Development Administration.
3. to find out some way to promote their participation in this matter.

The sample group consisted of 122 Members of Tambol administrative Organization in Muang Nakornpathom District, Nakornpathom Province. The data was collected by using questionnaires with the returning of 98 questionnaires(80.32%). The data was analyzed by using statistics including percentage, mean and standard deviation was used to describe the data and t - test , F - test and LSD were employed to test the hypotheses.

The findings were summed up below :

1. The Tambol Administrative Organization members as a whole participated in

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local development administration at a high level. Even when each aspect was considered individually, the results were still the same. These aspects could be ranked from the highest average score to the lowest as follows : participation in decision-making, meeting, project consideration, evaluation, implementation, respectively.

2. The factors found to have a significant with their participation in local development administration were education, income, receiving training, contact with related officials, knowledge and understanding of the operation in the Tambol administrative organization.

3. The factors found to have no significant with their participation in local development administration were age and occupation.
