

ABSTRACT

The research on Roles of the Committee on Examining and Monitoring Administration of the Provincial Police as Viewed by the Committeemen under Provincial Police, Region 7, had objectives to study 1) opinions of the Committee toward their roles 2) opinions of the Committee toward the committee's structure 3) participation of roles of the Committee and 4) factors that had impacts on opinions of roles of the Committee that were factors of personal information, opinions toward the committee's structure and participation of the committeemen.

Sampling population was 71 committeemen; from 6 positions and 7 positions of honourable committeemen. Questionnaire was used in gathering information and data. Statistics used in the research were Percentage, Mean and Standard Deviation. Inferential Statistic which were t-test and F-test was used to test the hypothesis.

The research found as follows;

1. The committeemen were men, with average age between 50-55, education background was master degree and average income was between 35,001-50,000.
2. The committeemen attended the meeting between 5-8 times during the past one-year.
3. The committeemen agreed with the structure of the committee.
4. Level of participation of the committeemen in examining and monitoring administration was at medium level. They had high level of participation in terms of expression of opinions, but they had low level of participation in the activities.

5. The committeemen agreed at high level in overall picture and each aspect toward the implementation of the committee. The level was roles in aspects of administration and supervision, facilitation of justice in criminal cases, general services and improvement of places and surrounding environment.

6. Factors that had impacts on the committeemen's opinions were income and their participation. Factors of age, educational background, opinions toward the committee's structure had no impact on the opinions of roles of the committee.

Recommendations were as follows;

The author recommended that the Royal Thai Police should organize training and seminar to make the officers learn of importance of the policy, support more budget and personnel, support the operators to have more knowledge and understanding on the roles and duty, steps of policy making, participation in the activities and to publicize to the local people, so that they realized their rights and duties in participating in local activities.
