

Pakasit Aembutr 2013: The Construction of Goalball Skills Test for Pratomsuksa 4 - 6 Students in the Bangkok School for the Blind. Master of Arts (Physical Education), Major Field : Physical Education, Department of Physical Education. Thesis Advisor: Miss Achara Soachalerm, Ph.D. 111 pages.

This research aimed to construction a test for Goalball Skills for Pratomsuksa 4 - 6 students in the Bangkok School for the Blind. The test included: (1) goal-shooting prevention (2) goal-shooting diagonally (3) goal-shooting parallel lines. The validity was established by 3 experts. The test-retest method was applied to determine the reliability in a seven-day interval. The total research population were 37 students, which were 20 boys and 17 girls from Pratomsuksa 4 - 6 students of the School of the Blind in Bangkok. The data were analyzed by using mean, standard deviation and Pearson's Product- Moment Correlation Coefficient and norms using T-scores.

The results showed that the constructed test for Goalball skills, which included (1) goal-shooting prevention (2) goal-shooting diagonally (3) goal-shooting parallel lines had a content accuracy at 1.00 which meant very good in all items. Reliability were .92, .86 and .84 for boys which meant very good, good and good, .85, .89 and .82 for girls which meant good in all items, respectively. Objectivity were .96, .94 and .97 for boys which meant very good, good and very good, .84, .91 and .88 for girls which meant accepted, good and good, respectively.

According to the research results, the test, which was constructed by the researcher had good quality and is suitable to implement with the Pratomsuksa 4 – 6 students in other schools for the blind.
