

Thesis Title: Supply Administration with Result-based Management of Subdistrict Municipalities in Phetchaburi Province **Researcher:** Ms. Rossukon Inhom **Major:** Urban and Rural Community Administration and Development **Year:** 2013 **Advisor:** Asst. Abstract

The objectives of this quantitative research were to: 1) examine supply administration with result-based management of subdistrict municipalities in Phetchaburi Province, 2) examine the relationship between supply administration and result-based management practice, and 3) synthesize proper guideline for a better result-based administration of the municipalities. There were 180 samples drawn from administrators, permanent secretaries, and heads of the officials, officials, and other personnel in the supply offices of subdistrict municipalities. The tool used for collecting data was a questionnaire. The data were analyzed by using percentage, mean, standard deviation, and Pearson's Product Moment Correlation Coefficient.

The research results were as follows:

1. The supply administration with the result-based management performed by the municipalities was overall at a high level, ranked from the higher mean scores as the aspects of objective setting, performance according to supply regulations, and analysis of work and performance improvement. All aspects of result-based management performance such as supply procurement, supply disposal, and supply control, were at a high level.
2. There was a positive relationship at a high level between supply administration and result-based performance of the municipalities in Phetchaburi Province.
3. The guideline for a better administration with result-based management involved planning supply procurement with other involved personnel, reporting the supply used when they were defective, doing statistical report at the end of fiscal year, and holding conference for collecting problems and obstacles in supply related performance.

The findings of the research indicated that the municipalities supply administration result-based could be better when they align their work with regulations, participation in planning and coordination, and use the principles of good governance.
