ABSTRACT

The purpose of this research was to study the requirement by students in Mathayom Suksa 3 class under the Conventional Education Department of Sra Kaeo Province, studied constituent part in about to make up one's mind for studied in 3 categories : tatus in quo of students, Family, Social economic Status and Learning Environments. Population were 9 schools 741 students in MS 3 Class under the Conventional Education Department in Sra Kaeo Province. The research instrument was a check list question and then analyzed by using percentage, frequencier, with emphasis on the essential rationalization. The results were as follow;

1. Status in quo of students such as sere, female had more mall; age between 16-18 year. All of students had permanence addren in Ta Praya district more than other disfrict, Family wholesomeness stayed with the family; family size 3-4 siblings totaled.

Parents' main profession were. Agriculture; in primary school; euerage income of parents were less than Bht. 1,0000 and their parents had paid out for school fell. Learning Environments such as ; it took 10 to 30 minutes to school. Come by bus; out of the 2.0 to 2.9 GPA. Received more than 1 to 2 schooling guidance, and had schooling guidauce from teacher guidance.

2. On requirements to pursue their study, 88.13 per cent was positive, 54.06 per cent opted for conventional field and 42.88 for vocational. Reasons were the necessity to seek additional in come, hight salary, high job security and welfare in the selected field of

study; field compatibility to the student's aptitude and that pursuance in conventional line will bring to the family and kin (the other students only 1.75 per cent negative, with 10.12 per cent still not decided of those to pursue their study; Reasons were uncertainty of parental supports, uncertainty of MS 3 graduation and uncertainty of the capacity to pursue the study
